### CAVS LOOK TO REBOUND AGAINST EAGLES

After having every break and outcome go against them last week, the Highland Cavaliers will look to gather themselves and rebound against the Lambuth Eagles. UVA-Wise fell 41-13 on the road to fourth-ranked Georgetown College while Lambuth took care of its rival Cumberland University, 41-24, on the road.

This afternoon will be both teams second of three crossover Mid-South contests. The final game of the cross-overs for both squads will be next Saturday, Oct. 14th.

### CAVS SEEK 1ST FIVE WIN YEAR IN 5 SEASONS

UVA-Wise seeks to go back into territory it has not been in five years. The Cavs will try to take their next step in the 2006 campaign with a victory on Saturday afternoon. The team has not enjoyed a season with at least five wins since posting a 6-4 mark for the 2001 season. UVA-Wise had two of three seasons with at least six victories by going 6-3 in 1999 to go with the 2001 record.

### UVA-WISE REMAIN IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

UVA-Wise jumped into the NAIA national rankings at number 18 released on Monday afternoon. The 18th national ranking is the highest under fifth-year head coach Bruce Wasem. The Cavs reached 19th in 2005 after a 3-0 start. The Cavs are averaging 50.0 points per game with 200 points in four contests and at least 44 tallies in each game.

### CAVS TRY TO CLIP EAGLES FOR 1ST TIME

For the second week in a row, the Cavs will face a football program they have never defeated in the 16 years of UVA-Wise gridiron action. Lambuth has been able to prevail in all five of the two teams meetings including each of the last four seasons.

The Eagles have outscored the Cavs 163 to 59 points. Lambuth has an average of 20.8-point margin of victory in the series.

The series started when UVA-Wise made its first ever NAIA playoff appearance in 1995. Lambuth made the appearance short lived with a dominating 49-0 pasting in Jackson, TN.

Saturday will be only the second time the series has taken place in Wise. In 2003, the lone contest played in Wise have started three straight close games. The last three games have a total margin of victory of 20 points with two eight-point affairs before last season's come-from-behind four-tally Lambuth win.

**COACHING MATCHUP**

The week's head coaching matchup pits two long-time veteran coaches with their respective programs. Lambuth's 14th-year head coach Vic Wallace against fifth-year leader Bruce Wasem for the Cavs.

Wallace has compiled an impressive 90-50-1 mark over his tenure with the Eagles. His Lambuth teams have won four conference championships and have made six appearances in the NAIA playoffs ('94 - semifinals, '95 - semifinals, '96- quarterfinals, '99-quarterfinals, '00 - first round, '03 - first round). Before coming to Lambuth, Coach Wallace was the head coach at the University of St. Thomas (1986-1992) and at William and Jewell College (1981-1986).

Coach Wasem has been part of all 157 games in the Highland Cavaliers now 16th season. He is in his fifth year at the helm after taking over for his mentor Bill Ramseyer. The Cavs are 17-31 in the last just over four seasons and had a 4-7 year in 2006.

**CAVS OPPONENT LAST WEEK/LAST GAME**

**LAMBUTH (W, 41-24 at Cumberland (TN))**

Lebanon, TN -- After falling behind by a touchdown early, Lambuth exploded for 31 unanswered points in the final 17 minutes of the opening half and never trailed again for a 41-24 victory.

Trailing 31-7 at one point and 31-14 at the half, Cumberland battled back against its rival with a solid third quarter showing. The Bulldogs added a 17-yard scoring run and a 19-yard field goal to make the tally 31-24 heading into the final quarter.

The Eagles reasserted themselves in the last stanza. Ryan Nanney hit a 26-yard field goal four minutes in and Josh Garza found Ryan Harris from 14 yards out for the 41-24 final.

On his way to being the Mid-South "Offensive Player of the Week," Garza accounted for 243 yards of total offense. He rushed 19 times for 111 yards and a 37-yard TD run while completing nine of 12 passes for 132 yards and two more scores. The top receiving target was Harris' five catches for 74 yards and two TDs. Tailback Kevin Haynes rushed 24 times for 107 yards and a TD. OLB Jason Hoath had 10 stops with Stephen Moten 1.5 sacks, 2 FF and 7 TT.

## 2005 MEETING - EAGLES LATE TD'S EDGE CAVS

Lambuth completed its fourth quarter comeback with a 49-yard touchdown pass with 2:35 left in the game to take away the victory from UVA-Wise. The Eagles found the endzone two times in just over two minutes of the final 4:59 and saw the Cavs come up a half yard short on fourth down to stop their drive for the 25-21 final score.

The Cavs special teams paved the way for all three of their scores. Kendall Gibson blocked a punt and returned it 26 yards for a score. Corey Wheeler ran an interception 69 yards for a score and picked off another pass to set up the lone offensive touchdown.

## MORGAN BECOMES 5TH 2,000-YARD CAVS RUSHER

The current NAIA's leading rusher, Ra'Shad Morgan, became the 5th 2,000-yard career rusher last Saturday. The junior, who is averaging a national-leading 154.8 yards per game, ran for 111 yards on 26 carries against 4th-ranked Georgetown.

He set a new season-best of 774 yards in five games and moved up to 2,064 yards for his career. Morgan is now fifth and ready to move into 4th Saturday. Ralph Carter (1993-96) is now 4th with 2,120 yards meaning Morgan needs only 57 yards to move up. He also needs 236 yards in his quest to be the 5th 1,000-yard rusher in a season.

## EVANS AND YOUNG RECEIVERS MAKING MARK

One of the biggest differences in the 2006 UVA-Wise offense is the emergence of a talented receiving corps. The quartet of senior Herb Watson, sophomore Kendon Doe and freshmen Matt Barbour and Aric Evans have combined for 70 receptions covering 1,240 yards and 11 touchdowns.

In the last two weeks, Evans, a Cincinnati product, has had two outstanding games. Against Cumberland, the first-year wideout grabbed three balls for 119 yards and scoring catches of 57 and 52 yards. He followed that effort with five grabs for 170 yards and touchdowns catches of 59 and six yards.

Barbour (22 rec. for 338 yds.) and Doe (20 rec. for 336 yds.) still rank tops in receptions.

## DORSAINVIL QUIETLY HAVING MAKING OF A BIG YEAR

Junior Reggie Dorsainvil is making up for missing the final four games for the 2005 season with an injury. The defensive end is not only 3rd in total tackles (30) but leads the Mid-South with 1.0 sacks per game. His five sacks is on pace to be one of the top three for a single season (he needs 3 to be in the top five) and eight tackles for loss.

## Week 1

### UVA-Wise 44, Brevard 20

BREVARD, NC -- The Highland Cavaliers used a quick start, efficient offense and an opportunistic defense to rout Brevard College in the Tornados first ever contest. UVA-Wise scored the game's opening 17 points and 27-straight points after Brevard made its way on the board for the eventual 44-20 final score.

QB Randy Hippeard engineered the offense which totaled 454 yards while hitting 19 of 29 passing attempts for 255 and three touchdowns. His main target on the night was flanker Kendon Doe, who set career bests with seven catches for 110 yards and scoring catches of 12 and eight yards. Matt Barbour grabbed three passes for 56 yards and a 42-yard TD.

On the ground, Ra'Shad Morgan had a solid night with 139 yards on 21 carries with a 10-yard TD. Jason Lovett added 10 carries for 61 yards while Chris Laws had a four-yard score and FB Dustin Thompson scored his first TD of his career with a one-yard plunge.

Defensively, SS Matt Gular led with eight stops while MLB Joe Bodenheimer added seven tackles. DT Andrew Hutchings made the most of his two tackles with one tfl while recovering another fumble. Matt Hutchings added three tackles while forcing and recovering the same fumble.

After leading 24-13 at the half, UVA-Wise dominated the third quarter. The offense scored three times, the defense caused two fumbles and held Brevard to five offensive plays to increase the lead to 44-13 before winning 44-20.

## Week 2

### UVA-Wise 48, North Greenville 35

WISE, VA -- Ra'Shad Morgan rambled 45 yards with 48 seconds left to put UVA-Wise ahead of North Greenville for good in the Cavs' home opener. Cavs' Reggie Dorsainvil sacked the Crusader QB in the endzone forcing a fumble recovered by Matt Hutchings for the final score for the 48-35 final.

The Highland Cavaliers racked up 467 yards of total offense on 74 plays. Morgan posted his second 100-yard performance of the season with 149 yards on 28 carries with 4 TD's (10, 4, 5 and 45 yds.). QB Randy Hippeard had a solid outing by hitting 25 of 35 attempts for 288 yards with a four-yard TD and one int. Matt Barbour caught seven passes for 95 yards while Herb Watson added four balls for 62 yards and Kendon Doe four receptions for 30 yards and one TD.

Dorsainvil was the defensive standout. He had the key interception of the game to setup the leading score, added six tackles, two sacks for 13 yds. and forced two fumbles. Chad Hooker contributed 10 tackles and a tfl while Matt Gular and Corey Wheeler each had nine stops.

With the game tied 35-35, Dorsainvil intercepted Crusader QB Eric Moeller on the visitor 30-yardline. After an unsportsmanlike penalty, Morgan took the hand off and broke two tackles five yards past the line and continued until reaching paydirt in the endzone to make it 42-35 with 48 seconds left in the game. The Dorsainvil sack and Hutchings fumble recovery on the first NGU play of the next drive made the final 48-35.

## Week 3

### UVA-Wise 49, Southern Virginia 13

WISE, VA -- The Highland Cavalier offense amassed 581 yards of total offense and scored touchdowns on their first six possessions to blow past the Knights. UVA-Wise outscored Southern Virginia 22-0 in the second half to run away with a 49-13 victory.

UVA-Wise improved to 3-0 for the second-straight season and have now outscored their three opponents 47-0 in the third quarter of the opening three games.

Cavs' QB Randy Hippeard produced another efficient evening. He led drives of 78, 74, 75 and 64 for scores in the first half possessions and 51 and 67-yard drives in the second half. Hippeard completed 15 of 20 passes for 305 yards and a TD. Kendon Doe caught four passes for 109 yards and a six-yard TD. Matt Barbour grabbed four balls for 79 yards and Aric Evans pulled in three passes for 50 yards with a 29-yard TD. RB Ra'Shad Morgan was well under his season rushing average but scored five times on 86 yards. Chris Laws carried seven times for 92 yards.

On defense, UVA-Wise allowed 202 yards while holding Southern Virginia to -10 yards on the ground in 24 attempts. Corey Wheeler was the top tackler with nine stops, a tfl and a breakup. Reggie Dorsainvil provided two sacks, three tfl's and six tackles. Andrew Hutchings added two tfl's, 1.5 sacks and three stops. LB Chas Johnson tallied eight stops and a tfl.

Southern Virginia did total 282 yards on kick-off returns while only having 202 yards of total offense.

## Week 4

### UVA-Wise 59, Cumberland (TN) 42

WISE, VA -- Ra'Shad Morgan dashed to a record-setting 289 yards rushing and four touchdowns to help UVA-Wise race to its best start on the gridiron in a decade. Morgan was the engine in the Highland Cavaliers' potent offense for a 59-42 win over the Cumberland University Bulldogs.

UVA-Wise took its season mark to a perfect 4-0 and the first time the program has started with four wins since recording a 10-0 regular season in 1996, the team's last NAIA playoff appearance. The team has now surpassed 40 points in all four victories and have posted 200 points for a 50.0-point per game average. The Cavs' 59 point effort this afternoon is the most points they have scored since defeating the Newport Apprentice School, 63-7, in the fifth game of the 1999 season.

Morgan totaled his 289 yards rushing on 34 carries to shatter the old UVA-Wise single game rushing record of 248 yards set by Greg Thomas vs. Tusculum in 1996. The junior found the endzone on scampers of 51, 36, 4 and 12 yards to take his season total to 14 touchdowns.

QB Randy Hippeard ran the Cavs offense again solidly as the unit produced a season-best 691 yards of total offense, with 354 yards passing and 337 yards rushing, and 31 first downs. Hippeard completed 15 of 24 attempts for 354 yards and 3 TDs. Aric Evans caught 3 passes for 119 yards and scoring catches of 52 and 57 yards. Herb Watson grabbed 4 passes for 72 yards and a 32-yard TD.

Defensively, Reggie Dorsainvil paced the charge with a career-high 11 tackles, 2.5 tfl's, a sack and forced a fumble. Corey Wheeler added 7 stops, Matt Hutchings produced a sack and forced a fumble on the play and Eric Ludden grabbed an interception.

Cumberland took control early with TDs on their first two possessions to go ahead 14-0. The Cavs answered with 2 scores of their own with a Morgan 51-yard run at the end of the 3rd quarter and Evans 52-yard strike from Hippeard.

Tied 21-21, Ray Damm connected for a 23-yard field goal before Evans streak down the sideline with a 57-yard scoring catch for a 31-21 halftime lead. The Cavs outscored the Bulldogs 28-21 in the second half to go on for the 59-42 victory.

### Georgetown 41, UVA-Wise 13

GEORGETOWN, KY -- The clouds moved into Toyota Stadium for the kick-off and the upset hopes of the Highland Cavaliers moved out. Fourth-ranked Georgetown College scored on its first offensive play as John Keene ran in a fumble recovery to set the tone of the day to defeat 18th-ranked University of Virginia's College at Wise, 41-13.

Freshman Aric Evans was the offensive bright spot for the Cavs. He caught five passes for 170 yards and two TDs of 59 and 6 yards. RB Ra'Shad Morgan produced his 4th 100-yard game with 111 yards on 26 carries. QB Randy Hippeard struggled in the pocket completing 15 of 38 passes for 247 yards with one TD and three interceptions on the wet afternoon. The UVA-Wise offense did outgain Georgetown 413 to 391 yards.

MLB Ben Robertson had a solid game in his first time starting back from injury with 11 tackles while DE Matt Hutchings had two tackles for loss. SS Matt Gular picked off his first collegiate pass, had one tackle for loss and six tackles.

Georgetown QB Jeff Smith rushed through the middle of the Cavs' line on the first offensive play for 39 yards before Brandon Moore forced a fumble where Keene scooped up the loose ball to take it 26 yards for the touchdown and 7-0 lead. Clay Hamblen picked off Hippeard passes on both of the UVA-Wise first two possessions. Smith found James Brown from 28 yards on the first play after the second INT for a 14-0 lead after a quarter.

The Tigers returned a punt for an 89-yard score and another rushing score for a 28-0 halftime lead. Trailing 38-0, the Cavs found the endzone two times in the final stanza to bring the final to 41-13.
