### HIGHLAND CAVALIERS SEEK NEW WIN HIGH UNDER WASEM AND KEEP PLAYOFF HOPES ALIVE

The Highland Cavaliers seek to give head coach Bruce Wasem a new single season win high under his direction while keeping the NAIA playoff hopes alive.

UVa-Wise had its third best season in the 17-year history last season at 8-3 and equaled the win total by improving to 8-1 last week. Ninth-rated UVa-Wise would set its third best record for the second year in a row and third time the squad has reached nine wins by defeating 22nd-ranked University of the Cumberland on Saturday.

The Highland Cavaliers will also try to keep their post season dreams alive. UVa-Wise has not qualified for the NAIA playoffs in since 1995 and 1996 where it fell in the first round each season.

### CAVS AIM FOR FIRST SHARE OF EAST CROWN

The Saturday contest will also go a long way in determining the Mid-South East Division champion. UVa-Wise can clinch its first share the divisional championship since joining the league for the 2002 campaign.

The Highland Cavaliers moved into sole possession of the top spot by going to 3-0 after winning, 42-37, at Union. With a weekend victory, the Cavs can do no worse than tie the winner of the Pikeville vs. Georgetown contest, who both are 2-1.

The Cumberland fell to Georgetown, 27-10, a week ago to go to 2-1 in the league themselves for a three-way tie for second place.

### SERIES OF STREAKS SET FOR 14TH AFFAIR

Just like many baseball hitters, the series between the Cumberland and UVa-Wise is nothing less than streaky. The Patriots won the first two bouts and the past five years with the Cavs taking the middle six meetings.

This is the most faced opponent of the 17-year UVa-Wise football program history. Saturday will mark the 14th matchup between the squads. With a 40-34 overtime victory in one of the most exciting games of the 2006 season, the Patriots took the series lead 7-6.

The Patriots have also claimed the past three games played at Carl Smith Stadium and have not lost in Wise since the 2000 season, 31-21. The overall points scored are also very close of 373 to 334.

## CAVS OPPONENT LAST WEEK/LAST GAME

**UCUMBERLANDS (L, 10-27 at Williamsburg, Ky.)**

In the premiere contest of the NAIA last weekend, Georgetown College pulled off the road victory, 27-10, over host UCumberlands.

The Patriots held two leads in the game of 3-0 and then 10-7 when Caleb Davis returned an interception 79 yards for a score. Georgetown scored on a 57-yard scoring strike and never trailed again. The Tigers held a 14-10 halftime lead and scored the only 13 points of the second half.

RB Moses Cochran ran for 102 yards on 19 attempts for the Cumberlands. Brian Abshire had 14 tackles and Jeremy Kidd added 10 with 2.5 tackles for loss. Georgetown outgained the home team 415 to 171.

## LAST MEETING IN WISE

Host UVa-Wise scored first on a 27-yard Ray Damm field goal but would not lead again as the Cumberlands held a 26-10 halftime score on the way to a 40-17 final tally on Oct. 29th of 2005.

The Patriots Moses Cochran ran for 132 yards on 19 carries with a 26-yard scoring run. The visitors posted 522 yards of total offense on 71 plays including 328 yards on the ground.

QB Randy Hippeard completed 14 of 26 passes for 200 yards and a 10-yard scoring pass with one interception. Hakeem Abdul-Saboor rushed 15 times for 59 yards and a four-yard plunge early in the four quarter. Ben Robertson posted 17 tackles.

## 2006 OVERTIME EXCITEMENT

Trailing 34-28, the Patriots' Freddy West was hit and fumbled right before the Cavs' endzone only to have Donny Atha recover in the endzone to tie the game. UVa-Wise blocked the extra point to make it 34-34.

QB Randy Hippeard was intercepted in the Cumberlands endzone on the third play by UVa-Wise to end regulation.

Jordan Jeffers ran around right end 23 yards on the Patriots' second play of overtime for a touchdown. UVa-Wise could manage only three yards on three plays before Hippeard was intercepted for the fourth time of the day on fourth down to end the contest, 40-34.

QB Kyle King rushed 20 times for 113 yards and one-yard score. He also passes 10 times, completing four for 103 yards and two scores while being picked off once. WR Matt Jones grabbed two passes for 57 yards including a 28-yard score.

RB Ra'Shad Morgan ran 23 times for just 76 yards and a six-yard touchdown while catching seven passes for 22 yards. Hippeard completed 28 of 50 passes for 318 yards, four touchdowns but threw four interceptions. WRs Matt Barbour and Aric Evans had big days with six catches apiece for 102 and 101 yards and three TDs.

## LOVETT SETS 3 & ANOTHER TEAM SEASON RECORDS FALL

UVa-Wise WR Jason Lovett set three season records while the team broke two season marks.

Lovett broke teammates Aric Evans' 2006 receiving numbers for receiving yards and touchdowns catches. Lovett had 135 yards and four scores to give him 860 yards and 15 TD catches to surpass Evans 832 yards and 11 TDs. Lovett also broke the single season receptions mark with 10 receptions a week ago to give him 60 to surpass 54 by both Anthony Richards (1996) and Kendon Doe (2006).

The Cavs' offense broke last season's season records for most points scored and passing touchdowns. In 2006, UVa-Wise scored 444 points but with the 42 tallies posted at Union the team now has 451 points with two regular season contests.

QB Randy Hippeard should break his season passing yards mark of 3,100 from 2006. Hippeard will enter Saturday with 2,841 yards after throwing for 434 yards last week. The junior needs just 260 yards to set a new standard.

Hippeard also will break his season total offense record of 3,110 with 222 yards against the Cumberlandds.

The UVa-Wise defense will equal the 1994 unit of 21 season interceptions with one pick-off on Saturday.

## Week 1

### UVA-Wise 41, Brevard 23

WISE, Va. -- All-American UVa-Wise running back Ra'Shad Morgan picked up where he left off a year ago by plowing through the Brevard College defense for 243 yards and four touchdowns in a season opening 41-23 victory.

Leading 34-23, Morgan sealed the win by breaking three Tornados' tacklers on his way to a 50-yard touchdown with 3:16 to cap his outstanding evening.

Morgan ran for his 243 yards, the third most in Cavs' history, on 29 carries for an 8.4-yard average with four scores. The senior running back set the school mark with 289 yards a year ago against Cumberland University.

QB Randy Hippeard hit 16 of 24 attempts for 218 yards and 2 TDs. Matt Barbour had his best day of his career with six catches for 110 yards and a 44-yard score. Jason Lovett had a solid day with five receptions for 72 yards and a 30-yard TD in his first game at wideout.

MLB Ben Robertson produced 15 tackles and a tackle for loss. Chas Johnson added 11 stops while Keith McBride and Jahmal Potter snatched interceptions.

The Tornados took its opening possession 51 yards on 14 plays for the opening score. Morgan went to work shortly afterwards by scoring three times over the final 15:40 of the first half from 16, four and one yard for a 21-14 halftime tally.

Hippeard hit Lovett on the first possession of the second half from 30 yards and early in the fourth connected from 44 yards with Barbour for a 34-23 score. The score remained 34-23 until Morgan's tough 50-yard burst through Brevard defenders for the 41-23 final.

## Week 2

### UVA-Wise 61, North Greenville 55

TIGERVILLE, SC -- QB Randy Hippeard directed what has to be the wildest comeback and game in the 17-year history of UVa-Wise football history. Hippeard helped the Cavs score 41 second half points, erase a 14-point deficit and score two touchdowns in the final 1:11 of the game for a 61-55 victory.

Trailing 55-48 with 2:42 left in the game, Hippeard went four for four, all to Jason Lovett, for 60 of the drives 72 yards to pull to within 55-54. The quarterback two-point conversion pass was intercepted by North Greenville's Donovan Davis at the goal line.

Cavs' Nate Bryant kicked an on-sides kick through the right two lines of the Crusaders' hands team and wide out Aric Evans fell on the ball for the visitors. UVa-Wise took over at its own 46-yard line. Hippeard hit Brad Ricker for passes of 21 and five yards and then Matt Barbour for 25 yards to the home three-yard line. The ball was handed off to All-American running back Ra'Shad Morgan who scampered through the left side for the final three yards to take it to 61-55 with 22 seconds.

North Greenville completed a 21-yard pass to the UVa-Wise 30-yard line before its next pass took the rest of the time off the clock to end the game.

Hippeard set three school single game records with 32 completions, 564 yards passing and six touchdowns through the air. The junior connected on 20 of 26 passes in the deciding second half for 358 yards. He had three targets set career-best marks on the night. Evans grabbed six passes for 212 yards and three scores, Barbour pulled in 10 passes for 179 yards and one TD and Lovett had nine catches for 122 yards and two scores.

### UVA-Wise 35, Concord 28

ATHENS, WV -- UVa-Wise picked off four passes and found a way to score the game winning points in the final two minutes to defeat Concord University, 35-28.

Tied 28-28 with 3:45 left in the game, RB Ra'Shad Morgan and QB Randy Hippeard combined for the game-winning drive. Morgan ran for two yards before Hippeard threw an incompleton and followed with back-to-back 17-yard passes to Jason Lovett and Matt Barbour to the home 24-yardline. Morgan worked his way through the Concord defense for 17 yards before following with a seven-yard scoring run over the left side to lead 35-28 with 2:05 in the game.

On 4th-and- 19 from its 41-yardline, LB Chas Johnson picked off the 4th Cavs' INT to seal the win.

DE Reggie Dorsainvil and the LB duo of Chad Hooker and Ben Robertson paced the defensive. Dorsainvil posted 11 tackles, two tfl's, 1.5 sacks and an INT. Hooker had a career-high 14 stops and Robertson added 11 tackles. Josh Spurlock and Marvin White also had Int's.

Morgan ran 110 yards on 24 carries with a TD and caught 6 passes for 56 yards including a 19-yard TD. Hippeard passed for 237 yards and 3 TDs including a 60-yd TD-strike to Aric Evans.

## Week 4

### UVA-Wise 63, Georgetown 56

WISE, Va. -- In front of a packed Carl Smith Stadium of well over 8,000 in attendance, the 10th-ranked UVA-Wise recorded its biggest Homecoming victory in program history over the 7th-ranked Georgetown College 63-56.

For the 3rd-straight contest, Ra'Shad Morgan capped the game-winning drive with a TD run as the Cavs scored last for the upset.

The win is the 1st in 8-year series and the highest ranked opponent UVA-Wise has ever defeated.

## Week 8

### UVA-Wise 43, Pikeville 10

Wise, Va. -- The 10th-ranked UVA-Wise defense had its best outing of the year and Ra'Shad Morgan provided the punch on offense in an overpowering victory, 43-10, over rival Pikeville College.

In a season best performance, the UVA-Wise defense allowed just 195 yards with 68 of those yards coming on the Bears final drive. The defenders also produced 5 sacks, 10 tackles for loss, 3 interceptions and a forced fumble.

The Cavs offense put back-to-back long drives of 10 plays for 98 yards and 12 plays for 82 yards capped by Hippeard scoring passes to Aric Evans and Lovett over 8 and 4 yards for a 14-0 score after one frame.

After leading 21-3 at the half, Lance Ayers connected on a 25-yard FG and Morgan ran in for 2 TDs to make it 37-3 at the end of the third.

The Highland Cavaliers equaled its season victories from a year as they went to 8-1 on the season.

UVA-Wise scored touchdowns on each of its first six possessions, all five of the first half and opened the second half with the final, to open a 42-3 lead. Union rode two visitor fumbles on a punt and then a kick-off to trigger a momentum change and post 34-unanswered points. • St. Francis (Ind.) holds the nation's longest active streak of conference championships with eight. Malone was the last school other than St. Francis to win the title back in 1998. St. Francis is fighting three other teams in the Mid-State Football Association - Mideast for the 2007 crown.

## Player of the Year Candidates?

Here is a snapshot of potential 2007 Player of the Year candidates:

• **Chad Cavender (Sioux Falls - SD, Sr., QB)** - Tops the NAIA in pass efficiency (175.5), seventh in passing yards (281.4) and total offense (290.1 ypg).

• **McKay Dunn (Southern Virginia Sr., WR)** - Leads the country in receiving yards (1,220), yards/game (135.6) and receptions/game (9.1); and has nine touchdowns.

• **Randy Hippeard (Virginia-Wise, Jr., QB)** - Led the country last year in passing yards (3,100); Stands No. 2 this year in passing (315.7 ypg) and total offense (321.0 ypg) and ranked second in pass efficiency (172.6).

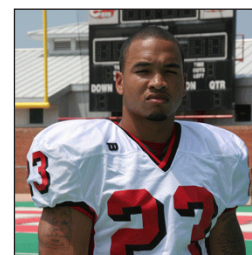
• **Jerome Messam (Graceland - Iowa, Sr., RB)** - Ranks second in the NAIA in rushing (141.9 ypg), second in all-purpose yards (188.6 ypg) and scoring (14.6 ppg).

• **Ra'Shad Morgan (Virginia-Wise, Sr., RB)** - 2006 AFCA All-American; Led the country in 2006 with 1,657 rushing yards and scoring (13.6 ppg); Leads NAIA this year in rushing (1,244 yards), rushing yards/game (155.5); touchdowns (24) and scoring (18.0 ppg) and third in all-purpose yards (187.5 ypg).

• **Cris Reisert (Ohio Dominican, Jr., QB)** - 2006 AFCA All-American; Led the country in 2006 in total offense (2,780 yards); Stands No. 1 this year in total offense (415.3 ypg), passing (413.4 ypg) and third in pass efficiency (171.6).

## Did you Know?

- In St. Xavier's (Ind.) win against No. 11 Malone (Oct. 27), senior WR Jim Doherty scored on a 99-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter. That play tied for the longest score in NAIA history -- the first since 1994.
- Bethel (Tenn.) set a school-record by scoring 66 points in the 66-48 win (Sept. 29) against Virginia-Wise. It broke a 71-year record.
- Four of eight teams in the Mid-States Football Association Mideast are ranked in the NAIA Top 25 this week (Oct. 29) -- No. 3 Ohio Dominican, No. 5 St. Francis (Ind.), No. 6 St. Xavier (Ill.) and No. 18 Malone.
- The Virginia-Wise football team is just one of two collegiate football teams in all divisions to have five sets of brothers on the squad. The squad is joined by only NCAA D1-AA Montana with that many sets of siblings.

quarter touchdown in Week 8. Overall, the Pioneers allow a nation-best 2.1 points/game and have four shutouts this year.

### Games to Watch - Week 10

No. 13 Friends (in white) battles No. 10 Bethel (Kan.) in a KCAC showdown. Bethel leads Friends (Kan.) by one game in the standings. These teams split the conference title last year as Friends shut out Bethel 21-0 holding the Threshers to 171 yards of total offense.

Playing its third straight Top 25 opponent, No. 18 Malone (Ohio) hosts No. 5 St. Francis (Ind.). Both teams are 4-1 in league play and looking up at No. 3 Ohio Dominican with a 5-0 mark. It may be a high-scoring game as both offenses rank in the NAIA Top 20 -- St. Francis ranks third in total offense (529.4) and fourth in scoring offense (47.0) while Malone is seventh in passing offense (307.9) and eighth in total offense (472.8).

A showdown in the Great Plains Athletic Conference has No. 8 Northwestern (Iowa) going to No. 15 Morningside (Iowa) -- both teams need a win and a loss by No. 1 Sioux Falls in order to catch USF with a 8-0 conference record. Northwestern won 33-7 in last year's meeting limiting Morningside to 153 yards of offense.

Sporting the nation's best rusher statistically (Ra'Shad Morgan) and second-best passer (Randy Hippeard), No. 9 Virginia-Wise hosts No. 22 Cumberland (Ky.). UVA holds a league-best 3-0 record with Cumberland's one game back. The Cumberland run defense will have to key on Morgan (1,244 yards, 24 TDs) - Cumberland gives up 134 rushing yards per game.

Riding a six-game winning streak after starting the season 0-3, No. 23 Minot State (N.D.) welcomes No. 12 Jamestown (N.D.) with first-place on the line in the Dakota Athletic Conference. Jamestown hung on for a 3-0 win last season with just 130 yards of offense. There were a combined 22 first downs.

### NAIA Football Coaches' Top 25 - Oct. 29 (Rating #8)

For the first time this year, the top 10 teams are unchanged in the eighth regular season National Association of Inter-collegiate Athletics (NAIA) Football Top 25 Coaches' Poll, announced Oct. 29. Sioux Falls (S.D.) is the No. 1 team in the land for the ninth straight poll after taking down Concordia (Neb.) 48-3 last Saturday. The defending national champions now own a 22-game winning streak and hold a 39-point, average margin-of-victory this year.

For the eighth straight week, Sioux Falls earned all 17 first-place votes and 425 points. In nine polls this year (including preseason), Sioux Falls has notched 151 of a possible 153 total first-place votes. USF's streak of nine straight polls at No. 1 to start a season is the longest since Carroll (Mont.) was the No. 1 team in all 11 polls in 2005.

No. 2 Carroll (Mont.), No. 3 Ohio Dominican, No. 4 Bethel (Tenn.) and No. 5 St. Francis (Ind.) all held their spots from

last week. Carroll snuck by then-No. 22 Montana State-Northern 10-3 as its defense continued its record-breaking pace. The Fighting Saints' defense, who had their 29-quarter streak of not allowing a touchdown snapped earlier this year, is giving up just 2.1 points/game. The all-time NAIA record for scoring defense in a season is held by St. Mary of the Plains (Kan.) back in 1989 when St. Mary allowed 1.3 points (13 points in 10 games).

Newcomers in the poll this week are No. 24 Black Hills State (S.D.) and No. 25 Sterling (Kan.), both sporting a five-game winning streak. The big win for Black Hills was against then-No. 8 Jamestown (N.D.) two weeks ago while Sterling's streak started with a 22-21 win against currently-ranked Northwest Oklahoma State (No. 20). BHSU is in the Top 25 for the first time since Sept. 17 and Sterling appears for the first time this season.

### Looking Back at the Action - Oct. 27

No. 6 St. Xavier (Ill.) moved into a three-way tie in the conference with a 36-20 win over No. 11 Malone (Ohio). St. Xavier used a 23-7 scoring run to seal the victory. QB Billy Yeo was 27-of-42 for 358 yards and two touchdowns including an NAIA record-tying 99-yarder in the third quarter.

No. 3 Carroll hung on for a 10-3 win over No. 22 Montana-State-Northern. With the win, Carroll sewed up its eight straight (shared and outright) conference crown. It was an offensive struggle for both teams with less than 550 yards of combined offense and a 6-for-33 showing on third-downs.

No. 19 Georgetown went into No. 17 Cumberlands (Ky.) and won 27-10. The Georgetown defense held Cumberlands scoreless in the second half and to 171 yards of total offense in the game.

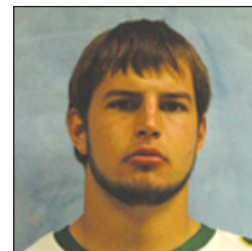
