For the third time in as many years, the UVA-Wise football team has a chance to start its season 3-0. The Highland Cavaliers have been able to dispatch of their first two opponents and will attempt for a third Saturday night at the Mountain Lions of Concord University.

UVA-Wise was able to defeat North Greenville, Chowan and Southern Virginia to start 2005 and repeated the start with victories over Brevard, North Greenville and Southern Virginia

CAVS TRY TO CONTINUE RUN OVER NCAA DII SQUADS

Over the last two plus seasons, UVA-Wise has found a great deal of success against NCAA Division II programs. The Cavs went 2-0 the past two seasons against Division II teams --wins over North Greenville and Chowan for 2004 and Brevard and North Greenville a year ago. UVA-Wise ran the streak to 6-0 after the opening two contests this season.

The last Cavs' defeat came at the hands of Mars Hill College on the road, 41-13, in the fourth game of the 2004 season.

UVA-WISE AIMS TO EVEN SERIES

For the first time since the 2000 season, UVA-Wise will face Concord. The two programs met three-straight seasons from 1998 through 2000. The Mountain Lions were able to claim the first and third game of the short series to this point. The Highland Cavaliers lone victory came at Callaghan Stadium in the 1999 matchup.

CAVS OPPONENT LAST WEEK/LAST GAME

CONCORD (L, 16-23 at Tiffin, Ohio)

In the season opener, Concord fought hard but could not pull off the upset of then 27th-ranked Tiffin University on August 25th falling by a 23-16 final.

After a scoreless opening quarter, the teams posted 33 tallies in the second stanza. Leading 7-0, the Mountain Lions saw the Tiffin Dragons' Alvin McKnight plunge in from a yard to tie the contest, 7-7. Concord led two more times, 10-7 and 16-14, before Tiffin hit a 40-yard field goal with 19 seconds in the first half to go ahead, 17-16, and would not trail again. The Dragons scored the only points of the second half in the third quarter for the 23-16 final.

Quarterback Dustin Greenwood ran for 57 yards and passed for another 109 to pace the Concord offense. Tank Tunstalle picked up the D2Football.com Defensive Player of the Week after posting 19 tackles, 12 solo and four tackles for loss in the contest.

CAVS PULL OFF THRILLING COMEBACK

Gunslinging quarterback Randy Hippeard directed what has to be the wildest comeback and game in the 17-year history of UVa-Wise football history. Hippeard helped the Cavs score 41 second half points, erase a 14-point deficit and two touchdowns in the final 1:11 of the game for a 61-55 victory Saturday night.

Trailing 55-48 with 2:42 left in the game, Hippeard went four for four, all to Jason Lovett, for 60 of the drives 72 yards to pull to within 55-54. The quarterback two-point conversion pass was intercepted by North Greenville's Donovan Davis at the goal line.

Cavs' Nate Bryant kicked an on-sides kick through the right two lines of the Crusaders' hands team and wide out Aric Evans fell on the ball for the visitors. UVa-Wise took over at its own 46-yard line. Hippeard hit Brad Ricker for passes of 21 and five yards and then Matt Barbour for 25 yards to the home three-yard line. The ball was handed off to All-American running back Ra'Shad Morgan who scampered through the left side for the final three yards to take it to 61-55 with 22 seconds.

North Greenville (0-1) completed a 21-yard pass to the UVa-Wise (2-0) 30-yard line before its next pass took the rest of the time off the clock to end the game.

Hippeard set three school single game records with 32 completions, 564 yards passing and six touchdowns through the air. The junior connected on 20 of 26 passes in the deciding second half for 358 yards. He had three targets set career-best marks on the night. Evans grabbed six passes for 212 yards and three scores, Barbour pulled in 10 passes for 179 yards and one TD and Lovett had nine catches for 122 yards and two scores.

Morgan had a tough night running as he ran 24 times for 61 yards but did have two touchdowns. Linebacker Ben Robertson led the defense with 10 tackles while Brandon Moore and Chad Hooker finished with eight and seven stops.

Crusader running back Matt Moore had a career night with 267 yards rushing on 21 carries and four scores.

After trailing 20-14 early in the second quarter, North Greenville scored 20 unanswered points the rest of the half including 13 points in the final 1:57 for a 34-20 score at intermission.

UVa-Wise was able to get back into the contest in the third stanza. The Cavs scored on its first second half possession and outscored the host 12-0 in the third quarter to make it 34-32 to set up the wild fourth quarter.

HIPPEARD EARNS TWO HONORS/ 2ND 5,000-YD PASSING IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Junior quarterback Randy Hippeard gained two honors for his record-setting performance last Saturday night at North Greenville. The signal-caller received the Victory Sports Network and Mid-South Conference Offensive Player of the Week after completing 32 of 48 passes for 564 yards, six touchdown passes and a one-yard scoring run. He set the school record for completions, passing yards, touchdown passes and total offense (565 yds) in a game.

Along with the honors, Hippeard joined David Nara (1991-94) as the only other UVA-Wise quarterback to surpass 5,000 career passing yards with 5,330 yards through the air in 21 career games.

The quarterback also broke another career record with his six touchdown performance as he moved into the career best passing touchdowns with 44 to break Nara's 40.

EVANS AND BARBOUR BECOME 9TH & 10TH 1,000-YARD RECEIVERS

The sophomore receiving duo of Aric Evans and Matt Barbour became the 9th and 10th Cavs' receivers to surpass the 1,000-yard mark for career receiving yards last Saturday night. Both players have suited up for just 13 games.

Evans has caught only 48 passes but has covered 1,045 yards for a 21.8-yard per catch average with 14 scores. Barbour has 64 receptions for 1,018 yards with six scores.

ROBERTSON SET TO MOVE INTO TOP 5 CAREER TACKLERS

Senior middle linebacker Ben Robertson has been a staple in the UVA-Wise defense now for the fourth year at middle linebacker. His efforts are about to place him in the top five tacklers in the program's 17-year history.

Robertson sits currently with 271 career tackles to his credit. He is 11 tackles behind former teammate Corey Wheeler (2003-06), who had 282.

With 29 more stops, Robertson would become just the fourth defender in school history with 300 or more in a career.

UVA-Wise 41, Brevard 23

WISE, Va. -- All-American UVa-Wise running back Ra'Shad Morgan picked up where he left off a year ago by plowing through the Brevard College defense for 243 yards and four touchdowns in a season opening 41-23 victory.

Leading 34-23, Morgan sealed the win by breaking three Tornados' tacklers on his way to a 50-yard touchdown with 3:16 to cap his outstanding evening.

Morgan ran for his 243 yards, the third most in Cavs' history, on 29 carries for an 8.4-yard average with four scores. The senior running back set the school mark with 289 yards a year ago against Cumberland University.

QB Randy Hippeard hit 16 of 24 attempts for 218 yards and 2 TDs. Matt Barbour had his best day of his career with six catches for 110 yards and a 44-yard score. Jason Lovett had a solid day with five receptions for 72 yards and a 30-yard TD in his first game at wideout.

MLB Ben Robertson produced 15 tackles and a tackle for loss. Chas Johnson added 11 stops while Keith McBride and Jahmal Potter snatched interceptions.

The Tornados took its opening possession 51 yards on 14 plays for the opening score. Morgan went to work shortly afterwards by scoring three times over the final 15:40 of the first half from 16, four and one yard for a 21-14 halftime tally.

Hippeard hit Lovett on the first possession of the second half from 30 yards and early in the fourth connected from 44 yards with Barbour for a 34-23 score. The score remained 34-23 until Morgan's tough 50-yard burst through Brevard defenders for the 41-23 final.
