HIGHLAND CAVALIERS RETURN TO MID-SOUTH EAST DIVISION ACTION, HOST BEARS SATURDAY

Uva-Wise returns to Mid-South East Division action for the first time in a month to start its drive for a championship on Saturday.

The Highland Cavaliers have been 1-0 in the division since upsetting then seventh-ranked Georgetown on September 22nd. The Mid-South switched to playing cross-over contests the past three weeks before the final four divisional games being played to finish the season through November 10th.

Pikeville invades Carl Smith Stadium on Saturday for the fourth time since 2001. The Bears fended off the Lambuth Eagles, 34-27, a week ago while the Cavs tied a school-record for points in their 69-28 thrashing of the Belhaven Blazers.

UVA-WISE LOOKS FOR SERIES ADVANTAGE

For the seventh year in a row, Uva-Wise will face off against Pikeville on the gridiron. The two schools separated by approximately 50 miles could not be closer in the series with each program taking three games apiece.

The Cavs took the opening two contests before the Bears rattled off three victories in a row. Uva-wise was able to even the series with an evening victory, 52-38, on the road.

Pikeville has produced good results in Wise. The Bears have won the last two affairs while the lone defeat came five seasons ago by just three points, 33-30.

The two games played in Jackson were both won by Uva-Wise in contests in which the Cavs totaled 38 points in each. The first meeting in 1998 has been the lone contest decided by more than one score, 38-20.

The Bears lead the total points scored, 200-150, in the series.

RANKING MOVES UP ONE SPOT

After holding steady last week, UVa-Wise moved up to 10th in the NAIA national rankings and to ninth in the Victory Sports Network rankings. The move was due to MidAmerica Nazarene losing.

CAVS OPPONENT LAST WEEK/LAST GAME

PIKEVILLE (W, 34-27 at Pikeville, Ky.)

After building a 24-7 lead in the first half, Pikeville saw Lambuth chip away at the margin until tying the game in the fourth quarter at 27-27. The Bears pulled out the win when De'Von Joseph ran into the endzone from 11 yards with 1:31 left in the game to seal the 34-27 victory.

In the game, Joseph ran 20 times for 111 yards and two TDs as well as catching seven passes for 57 yards. QB Dan Wideman threw 41 times, completed 28 of them for 259 yards while running 17 times for 76 yards with two going for scores. Pikeville totaled 449 yards of total offense while giving up 437.

HALEY MID-SOUTH DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF WEEK

Sophomore James Haley paced the UVa-Wise defense to its best outing of the season in being selected Mid-South Defensive Player of the week. The strong safety led the unit which recorded seven sacks, forced three fumbles, picked off two passes and held Belhaven scoreless in the second half. The strong safety posted 10 total tackles with 1.5 tackles for loss, a sack, forced a fumble, returned another fumble 46 yards to set up another Cavs' touchdown and broke up two passes.

On the season, the 5-11, 181-pound defensive back is fourth on the UVa-Wise defense with 42 tackles in seven games. He also had 10 tackles, nine solo, at fifth-ranked Bethel College and nine stops and a forced fumble against defending Mid-South East champ Georgetown (Ky.) College.

HIPPEARD SETS TWO RECORDS, EARNS HONOR

Junior Randy Hippeard had another outstanding contest on his record-setting career to earn Mid-South Offensive Player of the Week. The signal-caller threw for 259 yards on 13 completions in 18 attempts with five touchdowns. The 6-3, 216-pound QB set the program's career passing record with 6,694 passing yards to break David Nara's (1991-94) 6,517 yards.

The school record is Hippeard's fourth he has shattered in the 2007 season. He also now hold the career marks for pass completions (446), passing touchdowns (61) and total offense (6,738 yards).

Hippeard is the national leader in pass efficiency (178.3) while third in total offense (311.3 yds/gm) and passing yards (306.6 yds/gm).

CAVS GO OUT TO BIG LEAD IN 2006 MEETING

QB Randy Hippeard had his best passing day of his career to that point in helping UVa-Wise build a three TD lead on the way to a 52-38 victory at Pikeville in last year's meeting.

Hippeard completed 30 of 42 attempts for a then school-record 439 yards and five TDs. Aric Evans had a field day with eight catches for 152 yards and a score while Ra'Shad Morgan ran for 117 yards on 25 rushes and two scores. The offense totaled 543 yards.

The Cavs built a 24-10 halftime lead as they never trailed in the game. The lead was a three-score difference, 38-17 and 45-23, before settling on the final.

Bear WR Justin Lamb had a big night of eight catches for 159 yards and two TDs.

NEXT RECORDS SET TO FALL

Another week and a few more school records are set to fall. Randy Hippeard needs 1 passing TD to break his record from last year of 25. Ra'Shad Morgan can become the all-time all-purpose yards leader with 196 yards on Saturday.

UVA-Wise 41, Brevard 23

WISE, Va. -- All-American UVa-Wise running back Ra'Shad Morgan picked up where he left off a year ago by plowing through the Brevard College defense for 243 yards and four touchdowns in a season opening 41-23 victory.

Leading 34-23, Morgan sealed the win by breaking three Tornados' tacklers on his way to a 50-yard touchdown with 3:16 to cap his outstanding evening.

Morgan ran for his 243 yards, the third most in Cavs' history, on 29 carries for an 8.4-yard average with four scores. The senior running back set the school mark with 289 yards a year ago against Cumberland University.

QB Randy Hippeard hit 16 of 24 attempts for 218 yards and 2 TDs. Matt Barbour had his best day of his career with six catches for 110 yards and a 44-yard score. Jason Lovett had a solid day with five receptions for 72 yards and a 30-yard TD in his first game at wideout.

MLB Ben Robertson produced 15 tackles and a tackle for loss. Chas Johnson added 11 stops while Keith McBride and Jahmal Potter snatched interceptions.

The Tornados took its opening possession 51 yards on 14 plays for the opening score. Morgan went to work shortly afterwards by scoring three times over the final 15:40 of the first half from 16, four and one yard for a 21-14 halftime tally.

Hippeard hit Lovett on the first possession of the second half from 30 yards and early in the fourth connected from 44 yards with Barbour for a 34-23 score. The score remained 34-23 until Morgan's tough 50-yard burst through Brevard defenders for the 41-23 final.

UVA-Wise 61, North Greenville 55

TIGERVILLE, SC -- QB Randy Hippeard directed what has to be the wildest comeback and game in the 17-year history of UVa-Wise football history. Hippeard helped the Cavs score 41 second half points, erase a 14-point deficit and score two touchdowns in the final 1:11 of the game for a 61-55 victory.

Trailing 55-48 with 2:42 left in the game, Hippeard went four for four, all to Jason Lovett, for 60 of the drives 72 yards to pull to within 55-54. The quarterback two-point conversion pass was intercepted by North Greenville's Donovan Davis at the goal line.

Cavs' Nate Bryant kicked an on-sides kick through the right two lines of the Crusaders' hands team and wide out Aric Evans fell on the ball for the visitors. UVa-Wise took over at its own 46-yard line. Hippeard hit Brad Ricker for passes of 21 and five yards and then Matt Barbour for 25 yards to the home three-yard line. The ball was handed off to All-American running back Ra'Shad Morgan who scampered through the left side for the final three yards to take it to 61-55 with 22 seconds.

North Greenville completed a 21-yard pass to the UVa-Wise 30-yard line before its next pass took the rest of the time off the clock to end the game.

Hippeard set three school single game records with 32 completions, 564 yards passing and six touchdowns through the air. The junior connected on 20 of 26 passes in the deciding second half for 358 yards. He had three targets set career-best marks on the night. Evans grabbed six passes for 212 yards and three scores, Barbour pulled in 10 passes for 179 yards and one TD and Lovett had nine catches for 122 yards and two scores.

ATHENS, WV -- UVa-Wise picked off four passes and found a way to score the game winning points in the final two minutes to defeat Concord University, 35-28.

Tied 28-28 with 3:45 left in the game, RB Ra'Shad Morgan and QB Randy Hippeard combined for the game-winning drive. Morgan ran for two yards before Hippeard threw an incomplection and followed with back-to-back 17-yard passes to Jason Lovett and Matt Barbour to the home 24-yardline. Morgan worked his way through the Concord defense for 17 yards before following with a seven-yard scoring run over the left side to lead 35-28 with 2:05 in the game.

On 4th-and- 19 from its 41-yardline, LB Chas Johnson picked off the 4th Cavs' INT to seal the win.

DE Reggie Dorsainvil and the LB duo of Chad Hooker and Ben Robertson paced the defensive. Dorsainvil posted 11 tackles, two tfl's, 1.5 sacks and an INT. Hooker had a career-high 14 stops and Robertson added 11 tackles. Josh Spurlock and Marvin White also had Int's.

Morgan ran 110 yards on 24 carries with a TD and caught 6 passes for 56 yards including a 19-yard TD. Hippeard passed for 237 yards and 3 TDs including a 60-yd TD-strike to Aric Evans.

Week 4

UVA-Wise 63, Georgetown 56

WISE, Va. -- In front of a packed Carl Smith Stadium of well over 8,000 in attendance, the 10th-ranked UVA-Wise recorded its biggest Homecoming victory in program history over the seventh-ranked Georgetown College 63-56.

For the third-straight contest, Ra'Shad Morgan capped the game-winning drive with a touchdown run as the Cavs scored last to post the high-scoring upset.

The win is the first in eight games over the past eight years in the Mid-South Conference series between the two gridiron clubs and the highest ranked opponent UVA-Wise has ever defeated.

WR Jason Lovett produced his best game of his young career. He pulled in four passes for 181 yards and two touchdowns while he threw for another score covering 45 yards. Bethel 66, UVA-Wise 48

McKenzie, Tenn. -- The running back duo of Adrian Smith and Terrance Bell helped the fifth-ranked Bethel College offense run past seventh-ranked UVA-Wise. The pair of backs ran for 315 combined yards and five scores as the Wildcats' team rushed for 360 yards in a 66-48 victory.

UVA-Wise scored the game's opening points when Ra'Shad Morgan ran in from five yards five minutes into the first quarter. The touchdown proved to be the Cavs' lone lead of the game as Bethel rattled off the next 30 points to open a 30-6 lead.

QB Randy Hippeard passed for 309 yards and 3 TDs to become just the 2nd Cavs' passer to reach 6,000 career yards passing (6,272). He also rush for a 2-yard score. Morgan rushed for 149 yards on 24 carries and 3 scores. Matt Barbour hauled in 102 on 3 catches. Aric Evans pulled in a 65-yard TD while having 3 receptions for 85 yards. Jason Lovett grabbed 7 passes for 69 yards and 2 scores.

After an answering score by Bethel, Hippeard fired deep down the left side line to Evans for a 65-yard strike for a 37-34 score with 5:58 remaining in the third frame.

As it seemed to have all day long, Bethel had the answer for UVA-Wise. The home team put together the next two scoring drives and three of the next four to put go bach in front by 17 points two times with the second at 59-42.

Morgan scored one final time with 8:20 in the contest for a 59-48 game but was too little as Bethel went on a back-breaking six minute touchdown drive for the final points, 66-48.

UVA-Wise 49, Campbellsville 28

Campbellsville, Ky. -- Three key turnovers and the running of Ra'Shad Morgan enabled 11th-ranked UVA-Wise to get back in the win column at Campbellsville. The Cavs picked off two passes and forced another fumble to lead to 21 points while Morgan scored four times to defeat the Tigers, 49-28.

Morgan led a UVA-Wise ground game that amassed 298 yards on 44 carries. He accounted for 191 of those yards on 24 attempts including three touchdowns. Morgan added a fourth score with a 4-yard TD. Bruce McMullen and Jyron Barclay each rushed eight times for 63 and 43 yards.

QB Randy Hippeard attempted just 20 passes and completed 13 of them for 172 yards and three touchdowns. He set the Cavs' career total offense record on the day and now has 6,488 yards. Hakeem Abdul-Saboor paced the receivers with three grabs for 62 yards including a 45-yard touchdown.

LB Ben Robertson posted a career-high 17 tackles with a sack and tfl. Chas Johnson added 11 stops, a sack, one tfl and an INT. Reggie Dorsainvil forced a fumble to go with 7 TT while Gio Watford snatched his first pass.

Leading 21-7 with 3:24 left in the first half, Watford intercepted a heavily pressured Tigers' QB Ben Meffert and returned the pick 51 yards to the home six-yardline. Three plays later, Morgan took a middle screen pass four yards for a 28-7 halftime tally.

Campbellsville scored quickly on the first drive of the third quarter to pull within 28-14. Morgan was all UVA-Wise needed to answer on just two plays where he ran for 13 yards and then blazed through the Tiger defense for a 38-yard scoring scamper, 35-14.

On the second play of the next drive, Johnson picked off Meffert's second pass while having heavy pressure for 19 yards to the home nine-yardline. It took Morgan just one play to sliced through to paydirt and ice the game at 42-14 with 11:01 left in the third stanza.

The home team took 5:55 to answer for its third score of the day. Greg Fountain, who had 177 yards rushing on 32 carries and two touchdowns, plunged in from a yard. After a UVA-

Wise punt, Dorsainvil hit Campbellsville wideout Sean Thompson forcing a fumble recovered by the Cavs' Bryan Tolbert and returned it five yards to the 14-yardline. McMullen punctuated the three turnover with a third score to make it 49-21 before the Cavs pulled the starters for the whole fourth quarter in the 49-28 final.

For the second week in a row, the Cavs offense scored on the game's opening possession. Hippeard drove the unit 65 yards on 11 plays capped by a leaping grab in the back left part of the endzone by Matt Barbour from 17 yards. After Campbellsville tied the game at 7-7 at 1:41 in the first quarter, Hippeard found Abdul-Saboor down the right sideline from 45 yards with the second Cavs touchdown.

Week 7

UVA-Wise 69, Belhaven 28

Wise, Va. -- The 11th-ranked NAIA UVA-Wise football team mauled Belhaven College in every facet of the game. The Highland Cavaliers posted 710 yards of offense while the defense recorded seven sacks and five turnovers in a 69-28 victory over the Blazers.

UVA-Wise scored on 10 of its first 11 possessions and the defensive unit shut out Belhaven in the second half. The Cavs improved to 6-1 on the season and sealed its second winning season in a row for just the second time in school history. The 69 points also ties a school record set against Sue Bennett College during the 1994 season.

RB Ra'Shad Morgan had his best outing of the year. He ran for 237 yards on 28 carries and two TDs including a 62-yard burst in the first quarter. He

also caught a pass for 31 yards. His backup, freshman Jyron Barclay ran 14 times for 130 yards and a score.

QB Randy Hippeard became the Cavs' all-time leading passer after completing 13 of 18 attempts for 259 yards and 5 TDs. The junior has 6,694 career passing yards surpassing David Nara's (1991-94) 6,517. Matt Barbour grabbed 7 passes for 130 yards and 2 TDs. Jason Lovett caught 3 balls for 49 yards with 2 TDs and 2 two-point conversions as well as throwing a 47-yard end-around pass to Hakeem Abdul-Saboor. Aric Evans added 4 catches for 88 yards and a 32-yard TD.

The defense had its best outing of the season for UVA-Wise. The unit produced 7 sacks, forced 5 turnovers – 3 fumbles and 2 INTs and held the Blazers scoreless in the second half. Among the many standouts, James Haley had 10 tackles, a sack, forced a fumble, recovered another fumble and broke up 2 passes. Brett Hammack produced 7 stops, a sack and a FR. LB Ben Robertson picked off a pass and returned it 12 yards for a score to go with five tackles and 1.5 sacks. Nose tackle Danny Hinkle forced a fumble and had a sack of seven yards.

No. 13 St. Ambrose (Iowa) hosts Olivet Nazarene (Ill.) in a battle of unbeaten in the Mid-State Football Association - Midwest. Both schools boast a 3-0 record. SAU has taken the last two meetings and three of the last four games have been decided by fewer than five points.

NAIA Football Coaches' Top 25 - Oct. 15 (Rating #6)

The University of Sioux Falls (S.D.) holds the top spot for the seventh straight time and the top nine teams remain unchanged in the sixth regular season National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Football Top 25 Coaches' Poll (Oct. 15). Sioux Falls, who stands 7-0 this year and is running on a 21-game winning streak, received all 17 first-place votes and 425 points.

In seven polls this year, Sioux Falls has notched 117 of a possible 119 total first-place votes. USF's streak of seven straight polls at No. 1 to start a season is close to matching Carroll's (Mont.) beginning to 2006. Carroll hit the No. 1 spot for the first eight weeks last year before St. Francis (Ind.) vaulted to No. 1.

There were no upsets among the top 11 teams as the first nine schools held strong from last week's poll. No. 2 Carroll posted its fourth shutout of the year and third straight with a 42-0 blanking of Rocky Mountain (Mont.) - the Fighting Saints have allowed a mere nine points through seven games (1.3 ppg). No. 3 Ohio Dominican, No. 4 Bethel (Tenn.) and No. 5 St. Francis (Ind.) all won by at least five touchdowns last Saturday.

Entering the poll for the first time in six weeks is No. 25 Montana Tech. The Orediggers are 4-3 on the year after a 17-7 win at then-No. 14 Montana State-Northern. No. 21 Southern Nazarene (Okla.) gets in the Top 25 for the second time this season. Also, No. 19 Georgetown (Ky.) and No. 24 Northwestern Oklahoma State get back into the Top 25 after a two-week absence.

Looking Back at the Action - Oct. 13

No. 19 St. Xavier (Ill.) kept its hopes alive for a conference title with a 41-13 win over visiting No. 19 Urbana (Ohio). There was just a combined 118 rushing yards between the two schools but a whopping 785 passing yard. SXU quarterback Billy Yeo finished with 498 yards, four touchdowns on 39-of-54 passing.

No. 7 Lindenwood (Mo.) remained on top of the HAAC with a convincing 48-16 win over No. 13 Graceland (Mo.). LU forced four turnovers and held the Graceland offense to 273 total yards.

No. 18 Missouri Valley strengthened its chances of a second straight HAAC title with a 32-7 win over No. 10 MidAmerica Nazarene (Kan.). MVC finished with 564 yards of offense, 28 first downs and 411 yards rushing. Robert Holmes pounded out 268 yards on the ground for his third 100-yard game of the year.

No. 15 St. Ambrose (Iowa) forced five turnovers and defeated No. 25 McKendree (Ill.) 23-12. McKendree held a 346-295 edge in total offense but was just 4-of-13 in third-down situations.

Did you Know?

- Bethel (Tenn.) set a school-record by scoring 66 points in the 66-48 win (Sept. 29) against Virginia-Wise. It broke a 71-year old record.
- Five of eight teams in the Mid-States Football Association Mideast are ranked in the NAIA Top 25 this week (Oct. 15) -- No. 3 Ohio Dominican, No. 5 St. Francis (Ind.), No. 6 St. Xavier (Ill.), No. 16 Malone and No. 19 Urbana (Ohio).
- The Virginia-Wise football team is just one of two collegiate football teams in all divisions to have five sets of brothers on the squad. The squad is joined by only NCAA D1-AA Montana with that many sets of siblings.
- Carroll (Mont.) has not given up a touchdown through seven games this year and has allowed just three field goals (1.3 points allowed/game). The Saints are sitting on a 28-quarter streak of not giving up seven points -- the streak goes back to the fourth quarter in the Quarterfinal loss last year against St. Xavier (Ill.). Carroll has four shutouts this season.
