HIGHLAND CAVALIERS SEEK ROAD WIN OVER BEARS FOR HOPEFUL NAIA PLAYOFF INVITE

The Highland Cavaliers seek to rebound on the road Saturday to complete a hopeful run into the NAIA playoffs.

UVa-Wise will need a solid victory to clinch its third appearance in 17 years of the football program.

The Cavs will try for the second time to give head coach Bruce Wasem his most victories in a single season after dropping a heart-breaking 41-38 overtime defeat to the Cumberlands.

Host West Virginia Tech will try to snap its five-game losing streak in its home finale. The Golden Bears fell to the Bulldogs of Union College, 50-13.

CAVS AIM FOR FIRST SHARE OF EAST CROWN

The Cavs will try to lock up a share of their first Mid-South East Division crown this weekend. After losing the chance to win the title outright, UVa-Wise will have to settle for a share of the honor.

UVa-Wise is tied with both Georgetown and Cumberlands at 3-1. With the head-to-head results of each team being 1-1 against the other two clubs, Saturday's contests could result in nothing changing.

Georgetown hosts Union while the Cumberlands plays at Pikeville with both being fairly heavy favorites.

The Cavs had their highest finish of second last year after going 4-1 in Divsional contests.

FIRST TRIP TO MONTGOMERY

After facing the program's most common opponent, UVa-Wise will take the gridiron for the first time in Montgomery, West Virginia. The contest will be the third meeting between the two new Mid-South East rivals.

The Cavs have prevailed in the previous two meetings by an average of 34.5 points with both affairs being play in Wise. UVa-Wise opened Carl Smith Stadium with a 49-19 victory before taking the 45-6 decision last year.

COACHING MATCHUP

The week's head coaching matchup will be the first meeting of the minds between new Golden Bear interim head coach Bill Kehrer and Bruce Wasem for the Cavs.

Bill Kehrer took over the program after the first game of the year for West Virginia Tech. He came to Tech from the University of the South (Sewanee), where he was the defensive line and strength coach.

Coach Wasem is now in his sixth year as the head coach of the Cavs. He has been part of every game in Highland Cavaliers history aftering being an assistant coach in the program's first 11 campaigns under his mentor Bill Ramseyer. The Cavs are 29-35 during his tenure.

WV Tech (L, 13-50 at Barboursville, Ky.)

Union College scored the first 36 points of the game to rout West Virginia Tech by a 50-13 tally. The Bulldogs led 9-0 after a quarter before posting three touchdowns to put the game away 30-0 at the half.

Union totaled an impressive 565 yards of total offense with 541 of those coming through the air. West Virginia Tech managed 185 yards of offense on 66 plays.

Quarterback James Thorne completed five passes of 17 attempts for 112 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. Shedrick LoBrano rushed 23 times for 52 yards.

On defense, Chris Anderson ran back the an interception 87 yards for the Golden Bears first score. Eric Putmon and Frank Jennings paced the defense with 12 and 10 stops.

2006 - CAVS RUN AWAY IN THIRD ON WINDY DAY

After a surprising 3-0 first half score, UVa-Wise scored two touchdowns in the first five minutes of the third quarter and never looked back to take a 45-6 win over West Virginia Tech on 'Senior Day' in 2006.

Running back Ra'Shad Morgan had a solid outing by rushing for 198 yards on 36 carries for three touchdowns of six, eight and three yards. On a very windy day, quarterback Randy Hippeard had a tough afternoon with the conditions as he completed nine of 23 passes for 143 yards and two interceptions. The lone scoring pass of the day came when Brad Robbins threw a 50-yard strike to Aric Evans with 5:03 in the game.

Linebacker Ben Robertson had top defensive honors with 10 stops, three tackles for loss and was in on a sack. Reggie Dorsainvil added six tackles and a sack.

Golden Bear linebacker Eric Putmon led the defense with 14 tackles and two tackles for loss.

HALEY GARNERS SECOND MID-SOUTH HONOR

Sophomore strong safety James Haley garnered his second Mid-South Defensive Player of the Week honors with his outstanding performance against Cumberlands.

Haley produced a career-best 17 tackles, 12 solo, 2.5 tackles for loss of 10 yards, had two quarterback hurries and returned a fumble 68 yards for a touchdown.

Haley received his first weekly honor after having 10 tackles, five solo, 1.5 tackles for loss, a sack, forced a fumble, returned a fumble 46 yards and broke up two passes.

LOVETT READY TO BECOME FIRST 1K RECEIVER

Wide receiver Jason Lovett is ready to shatter his fourth UVA-Wise single season receiving mark on Saturday. In his first year as a receiver, Lovett enters the weekend just 13 yards shy of becoming the first Cavs pass catcher to ever have 1,000 yards in a season.

The Fredericksburg, Va. native already has set the UVA-Wise single season record with 987 yards along with new season marks of 68 receptions and 16 touchdown catches. He has a combined 23 catches for 262 yards and five touchdown catches the past two weeks.

MORGAN & BARBOUR SET TO HIT CENTURY MARK

RB Ra'Shad Morgan and WR Matt Barbour have a chance to hit the century marks for pass receptions in their careers. Morgan has 97 and Barbour one back at 96 going into Saturday.

Barbour has the second most yards in a season receiving with 846 yards, just 154 yards shy of 1,000 himself. He has equalled his 48 catches from a year ago when he had 729 yards.

Morgan can set two more school records Saturday. He needs one rushing TD to tie and two to break his own season mark of 25 set last year. Morgan can also take over the career mark with four rushing TDs.

On a team note, the UVA-Wise defense set the school season record for interceptions last week with 2 for 22 on the season, one more than 1994's 21.

UVA-Wise 41, Brevard 23

WISE, Va. -- All-American UVa-Wise running back Ra'Shad Morgan picked up where he left off a year ago by plowing through the Brevard College defense for 243 yards and four touchdowns in a season opening 41-23 victory.

Leading 34-23, Morgan sealed the win by breaking three Tornados' tacklers on his way to a 50-yard touchdown with 3:16 to cap his outstanding evening.

Morgan ran for his 243 yards, the third most in Cavs' history, on 29 carries for an 8.4-yard average with four scores. The senior running back set the school mark with 289 yards a year ago against Cumberland University.

QB Randy Hippeard hit 16 of 24 attempts for 218 yards and 2 TDs. Matt Barbour had his best day of his career with six catches for 110 yards and a 44-yard score. Jason Lovett had a solid day with five receptions for 72 yards and a 30-yard TD in his first game at wideout.

MLB Ben Robertson produced 15 tackles and a tackle for loss. Chas Johnson added 11 stops while Keith McBride and Jahmal Potter snatched interceptions.

The Tornados took its opening possession 51 yards on 14 plays for the opening score. Morgan went to work shortly afterwards by scoring three times over the final 15:40 of the first half from 16, four and one yard for a 21-14 halftime tally.

Hippeard hit Lovett on the first possession of the second half from 30 yards and early in the fourth connected from 44 yards with Barbour for a 34-23 score. The score remained 34-23 until Morgan's tough 50-yard burst through Brevard defenders for the 41-23 final.

UVA-Wise 61, North Greenville 55

TIGERVILLE, SC -- QB Randy Hippeard directed what has to be the wildest comeback and game in the 17-year history of UVa-Wise football history. Hippeard helped the Cavs score 41 second half points, erase a 14-point deficit and score two touchdowns in the final 1:11 of the game for a 61-55 victory.

Trailing 55-48 with 2:42 left in the game, Hippeard went four for four, all to Jason Lovett, for 60 of the drives 72 yards to pull to within 55-54. The quarterback two-point conversion pass was intercepted by North Greenville's Donovan Davis at the goal line.

Cavs' Nate Bryant kicked an on-sides kick through the right two lines of the Crusaders' hands team and wide out Aric Evans fell on the ball for the visitors. UVa-Wise took over at its own 46-yard line. Hippeard hit Brad Ricker for passes of 21 and five yards and then Matt Barbour for 25 yards to the home three-yard line. The ball was handed off to All-American running back Ra'Shad Morgan who scampered through the left side for the final three yards to take it to 61-55 with 22 seconds.

North Greenville completed a 21-yard pass to the UVa-Wise 30-yard line before its next pass took the rest of the time off the clock to end the game.

Hippeard set three school single game records with 32 completions, 564 yards passing and six touchdowns through the air. The junior connected on 20 of 26 passes in the deciding second half for 358 yards. He had three targets set career-best marks on the night. Evans grabbed six passes for 212 yards and three scores, Barbour pulled in 10 passes for 179 yards and one TD and Lovett had nine catches for 122 yards and two scores.

ATHENS, WV -- UVa-Wise picked off four passes and found a way to score the game winning points in the final two minutes to defeat Concord University, 35-28.

Tied 28-28 with 3:45 left in the game, RB Ra'Shad Morgan and QB Randy Hippeard combined for the game-winning drive. Morgan ran for two yards before Hippeard threw an incompleton and followed with back-to-back 17-yard passes to Jason Lovett and Matt Barbour to the home 24-yardline. Morgan worked his way through the Concord defense for 17 yards before following with a seven-yard scoring run over the left side to lead 35-28 with 2:05 in the game.

On 4th-and- 19 from its 41-yardline, LB Chas Johnson picked off the 4th Cavs' INT to seal the win.

DE Reggie Dorsainvil and the LB duo of Chad Hooker and Ben Robertson paced the defensive. Dorsainvil posted 11 tackles, two tfl's, 1.5 sacks and an INT. Hooker had a career-high 14 stops and Robertson added 11 tackles. Josh Spurlock and Marvin White also had Int's.

Morgan ran 110 yards on 24 carries with a TD and caught 6 passes for 56 yards including a 19-yard TD. Hippeard passed for 237 yards and 3 TDs including a 60-yd TD-strike to Aric Evans.

UVA-Wise 63, Georgetown 56

WISE, Va. -- In front of a packed Carl Smith Stadium of well over 8,000 in attendance, the 10th-ranked UVA-Wise recorded its biggest Homecoming victory in program history over the 7th-ranked Georgetown College 63-56.

For the 3rd-straight contest, Ra'Shad Morgan capped the game-winning drive with a TD run as the Cavs scored last for the upset.

The win is the 1st in 8-year series and the highest ranked opponent UVA-Wise has ever defeated.

WR Jason Lovett produced his best game with 4 passes for 181 yards and 2 TDs while he threw for another TD covering 45 yards. QB Randy Hippeard hit 16 of 35 attempts for 387 yards and 3 TDs. Morgan ran for just 68 yards on 28 attempts but did score 4 TDs.

LB Ben Robertson paced the Cavs defense with 10 TT, a sack, 1.5 tfls and an INT. James Haley had 9 stops, FF and 2BK while Chas Johnson added 9 TT, SK, and a tfl. Bryan Tolbert picked off one pass and battled down 2 more to go with 6 TT while Josh Spurlock snatched his 2nd pick in 2 games. Jerry Bentley had the other Cavs' sack. Brandon Moore returned a kick-off 88 yards for a TD and had 5 tackles.

After Hippeard was intercepted, Georgetown drove 23 yards on four plays capped by a four-yard Brown run to tie the game, 56-56, with 2:14 left.

Wise, Va. -- For the second season in a row, the 22nd-ranked University of the Cumberland came back late and went on to prevail over the ninth-rated University of Virginia's College at Wise in overtime. The Patriots' Ricky Walker edged into the endzone from three yards for the game-winning score for the 41-38 overtime win over the Cavs.

The two teams move into a three-way tie at the top of the Mid-South East Division at 3-1 with Georgetown. UVA-Wise drops to 8-2 while Cumberlandlands moves to 7-2. Cumberlandlands prevailed, 40-34, in overtime of the 2006 edition of the series in Williamsburg, Ky.

For UVA-Wise, quarterback Randy Hippeard completed 28 of 45 passes for 392 yards and two touchdowns to set a new school record with 3,233 passing yards on the year. Wideout Jason Lovett caught eight passes for 127 yards and a score while Aric Evans, who had a 41-yard scoring catch, and Matt Barbour pulled in five balls apiece for 98 and 65 yards. Final Regular Season Weekend Has Seven of 10 Conference Races Still up in the Air - Report #11

Of the 10 conferences, seven champions have to be decided in the final regular season weekend of NAIA football. Teams will be playing for conference bragging rights and also a chance at the postseason with 16 spots to fill. The 16-team NAIA National Championship field will be announced on Sunday (Nov. 11) afternoon. Three teams, No. 2 Carroll (Mont.), No. 1 Sioux Falls (S.D.) and No. 7 Lindenwood (Mo.), have already wrapped up conference titles -- Carroll and Sioux Falls now have won eight straight (outright and shared) championships each.

- **Jerome Messam (Graceland - Iowa, Sr., RB)** - Ranks second in the NAIA in rushing (141.9 ypg), second in all-purpose yards (188.6 ypg) and scoring (14.6 ppg).
- **Ra'Shad Morgan (Virginia-Wise, Sr., RB)** - 2006 AFCA All-American; Led the country in 2006 with 1,657 rushing yards and scoring (13.6 ppg); Leads NAIA this year in rushing (1,309 yards), rushing yards/game (145.4); touchdowns (26) and scoring (17.3 ppg) and third in all-purpose yards (178.3 ypg).
- **Cris Reisert (Ohio Dominican, Jr., QB)** - 2006 AFCA All-American; Led the country in 2006 in total offense (2,780 yards); Stands No. 1 this year in total offense (430.0 ypg), passing (427.7 ypg); passing yards (4,277), touchdown passes (43) and pass efficiency (174.8).

Did you Know?

- QB Cris Reisert of Ohio Dominican recently (Nov. 5) won his third NAIA Player of the Week (Offense) award this season -- it is the most in one season going back to the start of 2000.
- In 11 games this season, Azusa Pacific WR Jon Davis has scored 128 points to break school-legend Christian Okoye's single-season scoring record of 126 that he set during his 1986 All-America season.
- In St. Xavier's (Ind.) win against No. 11 Malone (Oct. 27), senior WR Jim Doherty scored on a 99-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter. That play tied for the longest score in NAIA history -- the first since 1994.
- Bethel (Tenn.) set a school-record by scoring 66 points in the 66-48 win (Sept. 29) against Virginia-Wise. It broke a 71-year record.
- Four of eight teams in the Mid-States Football Association Mideast are ranked in the NAIA Top 25 this week (Nov. 5) -- No. 3 Ohio Dominican, No. 5 St. Francis (Ind.), No. 6 St. Xavier (Ill.) and No. 23 Malone.
- The Virginia-Wise football team is just one of two collegiate football teams in all divisions to have five sets of brothers on the squad. The squad is joined by only NCAA D1-AA Montana with that many sets of siblings.
- Carroll (Mont.) went seven straight weeks this year without allowing a touchdown. That streak got snapped on a second-quarter touchdown in Week 8. Overall, the Pioneers allow a nation-low 3.5 points/game and have four shutouts this year.

No. 7 Lindenwood tries to keep its spotless record with a showdown in the HAAC with No. 12 Missouri Valley. The Lions of LU already have clinched their second conference title with Missouri Valley two games back in the race.

(S.D.) claimed their second straight GPAC Championship and sixth in the last seven years with a 54-0 blanking of Hastings (Neb.) - the win was the Cougars 23rd in-a-row. The six teams after Sioux Falls remain in the same position from last week after all won on Saturday.

No. 2 Carroll (Mont.) and No. 3 Ohio Dominican both moved to 10-0, two of three teams (Lindenwood) in the NAIA to claim 10 victories. No. 4 Bethel (Tenn.) is followed by No. 5 St. Francis (Ind.), No. 6 St. Xavier (Ill.) and No. 7 Lindenwood (Mo.).

For the ninth straight week, Sioux Falls earned all 17 first-place votes and 425 points. In 10 polls this year (including preseason), Sioux Falls has notched 168 of a possible 170 total first-place votes. USF's streak of 10 straight polls at No. 1 to start a season is the longest since Carroll (Mont.) was the No. 1 team in all 11 polls in 2005.



Cris Reisert of Ohio Dominican was recently named (Nov. 5) the NAIA Player of the Week for the third time this year.

Newcomers in the poll this week are No. 24 Azusa Pacific (Calif.) and No. 25 Southern Nazarene (Okla.). Azusa is riding the strength of a four-game winning streak to reach the Top 25 for the first time all year. SNU hits the Top 25 for the first time since Sept. 10 and will play for the Central States Football League Championship on Saturday versus Northwestern Oklahoma State.

Looking Back at the Action - Nov. 3

In three of the five Top 25 match-ups, the teams with the lower ranking came out on top. The only teams that avoided an upset were No. 5 St. Francis (Ind.) who rattled past No. 18 Malone (Ohio) 31-17 and No. 12 Jamestown (N.D.), who defeated No. 23 Minot State (N.D.) 19-14.

In No. 15 Morningside's (Iowa) upset of No. 8 Northwestern (Iowa) 33-7, the Mustangs forced six turnovers including picking off Northwest quarterbacks five times. Pulling to a first-place tie with No. 9 Virginia-Wise, No. 22 Cumberland (Ky.) won on the road 41-38 over UVa-Wise in overtime. Cumberland held the nation's top rusher, Ra'Shad Morgan to just 65 yards on 21 carries. In a battle for the top spot in the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference (KCAC), No. 13 Friends (Kan.) pulled off a 18-13 win against No. 10 Bethel (Kan.). Friends forced Bethel into four turnovers and held BC's offense to 209 yards. Both teams are tied for No. 1 in the KCAC heading into the final weekend.

Both Sioux Falls (S.D.) and Lindenwood (Mo.) wrapped up conference titles over the weekend -- the sixth overall for USF and second for Lindenwood.

to be the closest knit group in the nation with over a tenth of the roster related. The high number of siblings is the most of any NAIA football team and is equaled only by NCAA-Division I member University of Montana Grizzlies.

"Our key theme as a program is family," explains UVa-Wise sixth-year head coach Bruce Wasem. "It wasn't planned to have this many brothers on the team and I can honestly say I have never seen any football team in all my years at all levels whether it be high school or college with this many."

The five brother sets have come from all across the state of Virginia. Three sets, Henry and Jamal Potter of Virginia Beach, Kevin and Keon White of Newport News and Keith and Travis McBride from Hampton, call the Tidewater Region home. The other two pair, Aaron and John Mathis of Copper Hill and Josh and Luke Spurlock from Big Stone Gap, are southwest Virginia natives.

UVa-Wise, a small college of just over 1,900 students nestled in the Appalachian Mountains of southwest Virginia, is putting together one of the 17-year program's best seasons at 6-1 overall and a perfect 1-0 in the Mid-South Conference's East Division with the victory coming over perennial power and 19th-ranked Georgetown College, 63-56, in front of over 8,000 fans.
