The University of Virginia's College at Wise Board

February 6, 2026

The University of Virginia's College at Wise Board met virtually on Friday, February 6, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Mike Allen, Jimmy Adkins, Brian Blanton, Phillip Blevins, Taylor Cochran, Jonette Dixon Carpenter, Valeri Colyer, Kathy Curtis, Tami Ely, Marcia Gilliam, Marvin Gilliam, Cedric Green, Leton Harding, George E. Hunnicutt, Jr, Fran Hunt, Lewey Lee, Duane Miller, Karen Mullins, Rhonda Perkins, Ruby Rogers and William Thompson. Member absent is Don Green.

Chair Marcia Gilliam presided over the meeting and Dawn Jessee recorded the minutes. Chair Gilliam read the required virtual meeting notice in accordance with 22-3707 and 22-3701.1 of the Code of Virginia. Chancellor Donna Henry opened the meeting by leading everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

A motion was made by Mike Allen and seconded by Leton Harding to approve the agenda as presented. The motion received unanimous approval.

A motion was made by Ruby Rogers and seconded by Leton Harding to approve the minutes of the November 7, 2025 meeting of the College Board as presented. The motion received unanimous approval.

Remarks by Chair: Chair Gilliam welcomed everyone to the first meeting of 2026. She shared an article from UVA Today that gave accolades to Donald J. Sorah for being recognized by the State Council of Higher Education as one of 12 faculty members from across the Commonwealth for an "Outstanding Faculty" award. She encouraged everyone to read on page 15 of Chancellor's report all the good wins in athletics and the College Advancement and Alumni's Save the Date calendar on pages 41 and 42 for all the upcoming events.

Remarks by Vice Chair: Vice Chair Lee highlighted the many accomplishments and contributions to the College of former faculty member Buck Henson who served at UVA Wise for over 30 years and was instrumental in establishing the Poor Farm Society.

Remarks by Alumni Association Board Member: Mr. Jimmy Adkins thanked everyone for their steadfast dedication to UVA Wise and especially to Rosa Bott for being the best. The most recent board meeting was held on November 11. The next Alumni Board Association meeting is scheduled for February 10 (virtual). The Alumni Association is soliciting applications for new board members. Please see Jimmy Adkins or Corey Sanchez for an application to share with those who you think would enjoy serving. The Annual Spring Swing Golf Tournament will be held on April 17 at Lonesome Pine Country Club and the 38th Annual Cavalier Celebration Gala will be held on May 16 at the Lonesome Pine Country Club. Celebration tickets are still available for purchase. Community Fan Day,

sponsored by the Town of Wise will be held on Saturday, February 14 and the Day of Service coordinated by Student Affairs is scheduled for March 25 and is chance to come together to serve the College and region.

Remarks by Student Member Taylor Cochran: Ms. Cochran reported some of the highlights of the UVA Student Council Representatives Trip that took place in early November. This experience allowed student leaders from UVA Wise to connect with peers across the broader University of Virginia system. They met with several Vice Chancellors, who gave UVA Student Council insight into how Wise operates, and more importantly just how much heart goes into campus. During dinner discussions, they shared challenges and exchanged ideas, and it became clear that many initiatives already in place here at Wise are things these representatives hope to implement on Grounds. She thanked Chancellor Henry and all who supported this trip through their planning, execution, and presence. During the holiday season, the campus came alive with several well-loved traditions. The Lighting of Crockett and The Polar Express event marked the official start of the holidays on campus. SGA continued its tradition of giving out toboggans out to the first 150 students. Despite snowy and freezing temperatures, students gathered outdoors for the lighting ceremony before quickly migrating to the Student Center for hot chocolate. Whether the hot chocolate was just that good or it was simply warmer inside, there was none left once the first floor filled with students buzzing with holiday cheer. Spirits were even higher when students learned we were put on a delay, proving once again nothing spreads joy quite like unexpected extra sleep. After the first snowfall of the semester, Vice Chancellor Smith and Ms. Cochran hosted the Cookies and Convo event to engage directly with students and hear their concerns. One group shared a particular wholesome story: it was their first time ever seeing snow. They called their families to show them and stayed outside playing in it late into the night. Overall, students expressed feeling happy and supported on campus. The tradition of Late-Night Breakfast continued with an incredible turnout of students, faculty, and staff. Well over 350 students fueled up on bacon, pancakes, and the fan-favorite hash brown casserole in preparation for the always-stressful exam week. Following breakfast, many students made their way to the Convocation Center for Late Night Big Volleyball. At the start of this semester, The Office of Student Engagement hosted the Spring Activities Fair during the Tusculum basketball games. Student organizations brought impressive energy as they recruited new members and showcased the many ways students can get involved on campus. The enthusiasm in the room was undeniable, and it was clear that students are eager to cheer on their fellow Cavs and collect as many freebies as possible. Both men's and women's teams came away with big wins. As for SGA, there has been a record number of allocation requests and money granted to support student clubs and organizations. Recent allocations include supplies for Baptist Collegiate Ministries' mission trip, Advocacy Day, and ACS Tutor Night. They also chartered two new clubs including 9:37 Club, and The Astronomy Club. The Student Member of the Board updates included meetings with several senators to hear concerns and perspectives they have gathered from their peers. The conversations were thoughtful and insightful, highlighting both ongoing challenges and exciting opportunities for growth across campus. One idea that generated strong enthusiasm was the desire for a pep rally or tailgate-style experience prior to athletic events, particularly football games. Students expressed interest in a designated tent area, potentially sponsored by student organizations, campus groups,

or alumni, to bring students together and build school spirit. Many also shared that they would value opportunities to connect with faculty and staff in these spaces, especially with senior leadership. Meaningful interaction with campus “higher-ups” is something they are eager to experience even more of.

Ms. Cochran is currently working with SGA Vice President Blevins to route specific concerns from the discussion to the appropriate SGA committees for further action. Other topics raised will be shared with Chancellor Henry, Vice Chancellor Smith, and additional campus partners, as we reflect on areas of student concern, requests for expanded opportunities, and initiatives we believe would possibly benefit the student body. The students continue to demonstrate resilience, leadership, and a commitment to their campus community. Ms. Cochran shared that it is an honor to represent the students in this role and that she appreciated the continued support of the board and administration.

ACTION ITEMS

UVA Wise 2026-2027 Tuition and Required Fees: The University of Virginia's College at Wise is presenting tuition and fee rates consistent with the University of Virginia's strategy for undergraduate tuition and fees. It is the College's desire to keep tuition and fees as low as possible for our students. The Board of Visitors must also conduct a public hearing on the proposed increase. This material reflects a 2.5% increase for in-state and out-of-state undergraduate and graduate tuition and fees.

This recommendation is required to balance the budget due to mandated compensation increases proposed in the Governor's proposed budget with no additional base funding provided for affordable access, as well as inflationary pressures such as minimum wage increases, rising cost of healthcare, as well as goods and services. A motion was made by Leton Harding and seconded by Kathy Curtis to approve the resolution as presented. The motion received unanimous approval.

UVA Wise 2026-2027 Student Housing Rates: To maintain and effectively operate the college's residence halls, revenue must reflect the cost of operation. The Commonwealth of Virginia does not provide operational funding for residence halls. To continue providing housing opportunities that meet the needs and expectations of the student body, this recommendation is that we increase the current rates for residential students by 2% over the current year and to address the needs to add additional residential spaces, the college entered into a management lease with Land Star for 32 additional beds that are located within a mile of campus. These townhouses, named Clinch Valley Townhouses, are managed as a 12-month rental for our students, offering a more modern living experience. Housing is also requesting an increase to the lockout fee by \$10, and single room fee by \$250, to \$25 and \$1,250 respectively. A motion was made by Ruby Rogers and seconded by Bill Thompson to approve the resolution as presented. The motion received unanimous approval.

UVA Wise 2026-2027 Dining Rates: To maintain and effectively operate the College's dining services, revenue must reflect its cost of operation. The Commonwealth of Virginia does not provide funding for operational meal services. Staff members have listened to students on their desires for meal plan options and their views on food service on campus. The College has continued to address student concerns and requests which include modifying meal plan structures, hours of operation, and premium service options.

The College has continued to add options to address the needs of the students and those who look to the College for dining options. Students are provided with the option to obtain an unlimited dining plan which provides for all day unlimited food and beverage service in the Smith Dining Commons as well as 50 meal swipes for retail locations. The Cavalier Red Plan, available to upperclassmen, offers 175 meals that can be used in any dining location, plus \$50 bonus dollars.

The College has added additional residential space through a management agreement with Land Star that is located approximately one mile off our main campus. With the addition of these spaces, the College offers students an apartment style meal plan consisting of 105 meals that can be used in any dining location, plus \$100 bonus dollars. The College offers this meal plan to students who live in apartment style housing where each unit has its own kitchen.

The rates for these plans are recommended to increase by 3.8 percent over the current year. A motion was made by Kathy Curtis and seconded by Rhonda Perkins to approve the resolution as presented. The motion received unanimous approval.

UVA Wise 2026-2027 Conference Events and Wellness Rates: UVA Wise has a reputable, year-round Conferences & Events (C&E) program. C&E provides on campus event opportunities to various groups during the academic year, when space allows, and a plethora of opportunities during the summer months. C&E utilizes the College's academic classrooms, indoor and outdoor recreational facilities, conference and meeting spaces, as well as residential facilities (during summer months) to accommodate a variety of groups on campus.

During the summer, available space on campus is utilized to house interns from other universities completing local internships, overnight conference groups, band camps, weddings, receptions, baby showers, local high school events, bridal showers, athletic camps, and the Upward Bound and Governor's School programs.

Conferencing and events programming is proposed to remain at the same level as last year, with the exception of a \$1 increase to the lodging rate and \$.75 increase for the rental of tables/chairs when used outside the reservation location but remaining on campus. Summer programming, in addition to increasing utilization of spaces, also provides a recruitment and marketing tool for the College.

Since opening in September 2011, the David J. Prior Convocation Center has hosted numerous events each year and surpassed more than one million visitors in the facility last

year. The increases approved by the Board last year have proven to be sufficient to maintain the operations of the facility while remaining a premier site for events in our region. Given this, we are not requesting an additional increase for the Prior Center nor Greear Gym this year.

The meal rates for conferences and events are part of the casual dining rate negotiated with Chartwells. The per meal price is proposed to increase 3.8 percent per the dining rate increase for 2026-27.

A motion was made by Ruby Rogers and seconded by Kathy Curtis to approve the resolution as presented. The motion received unanimous approval.

UVA Wise 2026-2027 Parking Fees and Fines: The Commonwealth of Virginia does not provide four-year institutions with funding for the establishment and maintenance of parking facilities on campus. The administration is not proposing an increase to parking fees and fines. A motion was made by Leton Harding and seconded by Fran Hunt to approve the resolution as presented. The motion received unanimous approval.

Campus Master Plan: The University of Virginia's College at Wise Campus Master Plan outlines the future development of the College campus through the year 2035. A Master Planning Committee involving College senior administrators, faculty, staff, and students helped steer the development of the plan, with the assistance and guidance of the Office of the University Architect.

The College at Wise embarked on a new Master Plan process, to update the Plan that was completed in 2016. In collaboration with the UVA Office of the Architect, we engaged VMDO Architects and David Hill Studio – both firms have completed multiple projects for the College. The planning effort began in May 2025 and is expected to conclude in early 2026. The College established a Steering Committee (2 meetings) as well as a Working Group (monthly meetings), which used a blend of virtual and in-person meeting formats.

The Wise Campus Master Plan Update included visioning, analysis, and recommendations for future implementation of planning concepts. These findings will expand upon identified opportunities building on previous master planning work. This project sought to assess current space, create a future vision, conduct a current/future gap analysis, and create a range of recommendations for physical and programmatic changes considering UVA Wise's integral role within the state, region and local communities. The planning process included engagement of the campus and local community in addition to the Steering Committee and Working Group previously mentioned.

A motion was made by Jimmy Adkins and seconded by Bill Thompson to approve the UVA Wise Master Plan for the College as presented. The motion received unanimous approval.

Report Items:

Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) Accreditation Update: Gary Johnson, Provost and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs presented an update regarding the process required by the College's accrediting body -- Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). The preliminary report from the off-site review team was received in November 2025, the targeted response was due early January 2026 and the on-site team review is scheduled for April 2026. The QEP is not required but UVA Wise plans to move ahead with the revised First-Year Experience.

Legislative Update and 2026-2027 Proposed Operating Budget: The Virginia General Assembly session starts January 14 and adjourns March 14. Crossover is February 18 with the Finance and Appropriations committees completing action on budget on February 22. UVA Wise legislative priorities include access, enrollment and retention and capital requests of Darden Hall renovation and planning for new classroom building.

Chancellor's Report: Chancellor Henry reported that Spring 2026 enrollment is up 13% from last year, admitted students for fall 2025 is up 50% from last year and confirmed students are up 22% from last year. This is the third consecutive year of enrollment growth. The Honor the Future campaign raised more than \$103 million. The College has increased the brand awareness through sponsorship of WCYB's Friday Night Rivals, which earned more than 27,000 views per week for high school athletics and increased ARC geographies as far away as Pennsylvania now entering the top five in engagement for digital ads. A December Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service Economic Impact Study highlights that the College provides 1,029 jobs, \$94.4 million in output and \$5.4 million in combined state and local tax revenue. The report also found that the College's participation as facilitator for GO Virginia region one plays an important role in economic and community impact and our graduates work in critical fields, such as education (29%), healthcare (25%), business (12%) and computer/tech (11%). Chancellor Henry announced that Ralph Reid the new Vice Chancellor for Human Resources started in early January. UVA named Scott Beardsley as the 10th President. He is the former dean of the UVA Darden School of Business.

The next meeting will be May 8, 2026.

There being no additional business or comments the meeting adjourned at 12:10 p.m.

WHEREAS, the College Board previously discussed and approved a 2.5 percent increase in tuition for in-state and out-of-state students for planning in the six-year plan,

WHEREAS, the College Board wishes to maintain affordability desire to hold tuition for in-state, out-of-state, and graduate students at 2.5 percent,

WHEREAS, the College Board authorizes student fees for in-state, out-of-state, and graduate students to increase by 2.5 percent,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the UVA Wise College Board approve the tuition, required fees and other charges applicable to The University of Virginia's College at Wise.
